#### **A Lenten Doxology**

Worship music is so vast and didn't stop being penned when the Chalice Hymnal was published over 25 years ago. Hymnody and hymns continue to flow from inspired humans every day. On occasion I carefully place such texts in worship to familiar tunes. During the season of Lent, the text has shifted to the tune HAMBURG (what we know as *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*). Yes, it is a perfect doxology, as there is no "true" doxology. It varies within congregations.

#### What is a doxology?

The word comes from the Greek doxologia, "praise or glory," which is a combination of doxa, "glory," and logos, "a speaking." In music, it is simply a hymn or form of words containing an ascription of praise to God. I love an expansive text that alludes to a Creator God, Christ and Spirit, all together.

#### My Lenten challenge to you.

Find a verse of a hymn that contains what you would feel is a beautiful doxology and share it with me!





#### The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks

Her name was Henrietta Lacks, but scientists know her as HeLa. She was a poor Southern tobacco farmer who worked the same land as her slave ancestors, yet her cells -- taken without her knowledge -- became one of the most important tools in medicine. Henrietta's "immortal" cells helped develop the polio vac-



cine, unlocked secrets of cancer and viruses, and led to important advances in in vitro fertilization, cloning and gene mapping. Yet Henrietta Lacks remains virtually unknown, buried in an unmarked grave.

Henrietta's family did not learn of her "immortality" until more than twenty years after her death, when scientists investigating HeLa began using her husband and children in research without informed consent. And though the cells had launched a multimillion-dollar industry that sells human biological materials, her family never saw any of the profits.
